



# 2019 FULTON AWARDS

## SUBMISSION PROCEDURE

Awards and commendations will be given for concrete excellence in the categories:

- ☑ BUILDINGS UP TO 3-STOREY
- ☑ BUILDINGS MORE THAN 3-STOREY
- ☑ INFRASTRUCTURE UP TO R100 MILLION VALUE
- ☑ INFRASTRUCTURE > R100 MILLION VALUE
- ☑ INNOVATION IN CONCRETE PROJECTS
- ☑ INNOVATION IN CONCRETE
- ☑ ARCHITECTURAL CONCRETE

**NB:** If there are sufficient entries in the Building, Infrastructure and Architectural categories covering rehabilitation work, an additional category may be added to adjudicate these separately.

**RULES:** Rules concerning submission, conditions of entry, ownership, publication and conditions of the awards are set out on the next page.

**ENTRY FORM:** Complete the entry form in neat, legible writing on a paper copy of the pages provided. An electronic completed copy should be included on the memory stick provided.

**ENTRY PACK Memory Stick:** A blank memory stick is provided together with this entry pack. Entrants to return this self same memory stick and shall include all their completed entry information in electronic format on it. The memory stick must be placed into the plastic memory stick sleeve provided.

**PROJECT MOTIVATION:** As this project motivation may be published in the CSSA's printed media, accordingly the written submission must be of good quality. This submission may be evaluated and count towards part of the overall project score for the 2019 Fulton Awards.

**DRAWINGS:** Provide at least one general arrangement drawing or relevant details of the project submission indicating the important aspects of the project submission on size A2 folded into the plastic sleeve.

**BRIEF DESCRIPTION:** This information will be published in the Special Edition of CONCRETE BETON - FULTON AWARDS 2019. A maximum of 500 words must be submitted. It must be completed in Microsoft Word and saved on the memory stick provided, together with a printed copy inserted in the plastic sleeve. As the judges will consider quality of both grammar and content of all submissions, entrants should ensure the highest quality of their submissions in this regard.

**AUDIO-VISUAL SUMMARY:** This is an abridged motivation for use in the audio-visual presentations at both the main Gala Event and at the various branches during the Fulton Awards Roadshow. This must be completed on a printed copy and placed in the applicable sleeve and an electronic copy. It is also to be saved on the memory stick provided. Care must be given that content is clear and grammatically correct.

**BANNER SUMMARY:** This text information is to be used on the banner presentation displayed throughout the Fulton Awards Weekend.

These banners form the core material for use in the Banner Competition. Provide bullet-point salient facts about the project in MS Word format. A hard copy to be placed in the relevant sleeve and electronic copy to be included on the memory stick provided.

**PHOTOGRAPHS:** Provide approx 12 high-quality and visually stimulating pictures on memory stick.

Please note that the minimum resolution must be 300 d.p.i. and size 150mmx100mm of every photo submitted. Save on memory stick provided and place A5 size colour prints in sleeve provided. Provide 1 photograph of the team, and provide full names indicated from left to right, if this is available. Each photograph to include a 10-word description.

**OWNER'S APPROVAL:** Insert the written approval by owner/s and principal agent/s into the plastic sleeve as indicated.

**ROUTE MAP:** Provide GPS Coordinates for the site. Provide a detailed route map, indicating scale, to locate the project. Insert in sleeve indicated.

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## TERMS & CONDITIONS

### a. NOMINATIONS

Each nomination shall be for a single structure/initiative or part thereof situated or developed in one location within southern Africa. Submissions must be made with the approval of all the relevant principal parties concerned.

Each project/initiative must be completed or substantially completed between January 2017 and December 2018. Substantially completed means that at least 80% of the total value of the concrete works portion of the project would already have been claimed for in the last payment certificate for the project in the 2018 calendar year.

From the nominations, the judges reserve the right to reject any submission that, in their opinion, is not eligible for further adjudication, based on the information supplied. A shortlist will be compiled by the judges of nominations that they consider eligible for judging, and they must then be allowed access to these shortlisted projects/initiatives to enable on-site adjudication to take place.

The judges will be drawn from the Built Environment Sector - a concrete materials specialist, an architectural concrete specialist and a professional engineer with concrete experience.

The closing date for submission of projects/initiatives is the close of business on **Friday 31<sup>st</sup> August 2018**.

### b. ENTRIES

Once a nomination is accepted by the judges for entry, a full Entry Pack will be sent by courier to the nominating party for completion and payment of the entry fee. No entry will be considered without the relevant fee being paid at the time of submitting the Entry Pack. The closing date for submission of the completed Entry Packs is by the close of business on **Friday 30<sup>th</sup> November 2018**.

The person signing the Entry Form will be deemed by the Concrete Society to be the person responsible for the submission on the entry. All correspondence will be addressed to this person.

The entry fee of **R10,000, excluding VAT**, entitles entrants to enter the nomination in any two categories. Additional category entries can be made at an extra fee of **R2,500.00, excluding VAT**. The entry fee for "Innovation in Concrete" category is **R5,000.00 excluding VAT**.





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The categories for the 2019 Awards are as follows:

CATEGORY TITLE	TYPICAL EXAMPLES
Buildings up to 3-Storey	Residential, schools, commercial, factories, warehousing, industrial, etc.
Buildings more than 3-Storey	Office buildings, multi-family housing, etc.
Infrastructure up to R100 million value	Bridges, roads, water resources, marine structures, power, transportation, etc.
Infrastructure > R100 million value	As above, but of greater project value.
Innovation in concrete projects	Initiatives where totally new materials, techniques, technologies, applications, designs, and/or concepts, using concrete as the principal material have been developed and utilised for a project.
Innovation in concrete	Initiatives where totally new materials, techniques, technologies, applications, designs, and/or concepts, using concrete as the principal material have been developed.
Architectural concrete	Use of concrete as the principal construction material, demonstrating a unique and exceptional structure, surface finishes or particular detail, in an aesthetic manner.

## C. JUDGING OF FINAL ENTRIES

The judges must be allowed safe and reasonable access to all relevant parts of the project/initiative. A knowledgeable party, from whom further information can be obtained, must be on hand during site inspection by the judges.

For the Building and Architectural Concrete categories, it is essential that the architect be present. The judges will take the attitude and passion of the team involved in the entry into account, and it is advisable that where practical, the entire project team is in attendance at the time of judging. The judges reserve the right to reallocate the entry to an alternative category where applicable.

The focus of judging for the 2019 Fulton Awards will be on the material - concrete - and not on the project as a whole. Thus, irrespective of category, the criteria for adjudication that the judges will be using are:

- ▣ Quality of concrete - focusing on finish
- ▣ Sustainability - green building initiatives
- ▣ Inventive uses of concrete





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- ❑ Overall aesthetic impact of the concrete aspects of the structure
- ❑ Quality of the concrete finish
- ❑ Standard of workmanship of the concrete
- ❑ Effect of the concrete on the architectural landscape and environment
- ❑ Involvement of local community, transformation and health & safety initiatives

Some unique criteria will apply to the Innovation in Concrete categories:

- ❑ Significance of the use/application of the innovation
- ❑ Industry need for this innovation
- ❑ Does it address or contribute to sustainability issues?
- ❑ Will it make concrete more competitive and therefore, grow the market?
- ❑ Potential to replace alternative building materials

The decision of the judges will be binding on all parties. The discretion of the judges to make or withhold an award or awards is absolute, and they reserve the right to make no award if suitably worthy entries are not submitted. No form of discussion or correspondence relating to decisions made will be entered into by any of the judges.

## d. OWNERSHIP AND PUBLICATION RIGHTS

All material submitted in connection with entries shall become the property of the Concrete Society of Southern Africa NPC. The Concrete Society reserves the right, without payment of fees or royalties, to make whatever use it may consider desirable of material submitted in connection with the entries. This includes publication of material and photographs from the selected entries at its own discretion, irrespective of the results of the awards.

The Concrete Society also reserves the right to visit the site of the entrant to take any additional photographs or film footage it deems necessary to supplement that supplied by the entrant.
